SOMEONE IN WALES WILL within the next twelve months be facing prosecution under the new Corporate Manslaughter and Homicide Act which comes into force on 6th April 2008.



THE FINANCIAL CONSEQUENCES could see them forced out of business if they are found guilty



A MANAGING DIRECTOR or CHIEF EXECUTIVE COULD BE IMPRISONED if they cannot adequately demonstrate that they have appropriate policies and practices in place



The question is ... Are you and your organisation able and prepared to defend yourself against allegations of management failings which if proven could find at the very least your business being placed in jeopardy from any fines imposed or at worst a term of imprisonment. It is all very easy to say that we have never experienced death in our workplace but few can say that they have had no incidents which although may not have been serious in injury terms the difference between a modest injury and death is often a matter of "luck"

prosecution under this act for a driving related matter is higher than anything else. Not only does the organisation have a responsibility and duty of care to ensure the wellbeing of those who drive for work, they also face the consequences of their actions if they have not taken action to ensure they have practices and procedures in place which demonstrate that all reasonable steps have been taken to prevent serious and fatal road crashes.
